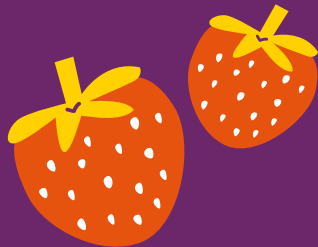

Stop 1 Wexford Town



Get to know Wexford town a by taking a walking tour. You may be surprised by the hidden history of this Viking town with links to the US Navy, the Archbishop of Canterbury and even Zorro! Afterwards, choose from many of the fantastic restaurants.

Stop 2 Gorey Town



This market town may have started out with chickens and horse fairs but these days it's populated with beautiful boutiques, wine shops and galleries. There are plenty of hotspots to explore including French's of Gorey, Wexford's oldest pub unchanged since the early 1800s.

Day 2



Stop 1 Hook Lighthouse



A World Heritage Site and one of the region's most popular attractions, this place will blow your mind – even if it's not windy that day! Your tour takes you from the medieval coal stores at the tower's base all the way to the viewing platform on the top.

Stop 2 Baginbun Beach



Visit beautiful Baginbun beach in south Wexford and enjoy exploring the sea caves by kayak with The Irish Experience. Alternatively, you could try beach yoga and a sauna experience after a dip in the Irish sea with Sweathouse.ie. Whatever you do, you'll fall in love with Baginbun.

Stop 2 Lobster Pot



You can't leave south Wexford without stopping by the Lobster Pot Restaurant in Carne. Serving the most delicious seasonal seafood dishes with an atmosphere of trad music sessions to match and a stones throw to the beautiful Carne beach, the Lobster Pot is a must-visit.

Stop 4 Kilmore Quay



Discover the charming whitewashed cottages and thatched roofs of Kilmore Quay, a small fishing village in County Wexford. Take a stroll along the picturesque harbour as colourful boats pass by, then travel to the deserted Saltee Islands to look for some adorable puffins.

Stop 5 IOAC



Make sure to pack your adventure side with you and head to the IOAC for thrilling adrenaline rushing adventure activities. You will get the chance to experience everything from high ropes, battlezone archery, kayaking, raft-building, crate stacking and so much more.

Stop 1

New Ross Town



Wander around this historic town and check out the striking street art depicting the Normans and the history of this medieval town. You'll find yourself wandering down meandering medieval lane-ways and stopping to admire the original Victorian shop fronts.

Stop 2

Enniscorthy Town



Enniscorthy Castle is the only castle in Ireland currently offering rooftop access, with amazing views of the town and Vinegar Hill. Enjoy exhibitions exploring local history and culture and showcasing designer Eileen Gray's acclaimed works in a beautiful town centre location.

Stop 3

Bunclody Golf Club



Bunclody Golf and Fishing Club is renowned for its charming setting on the banks of the River Slaney. With a clubhouse situated on 300 acres of breathtaking parklands and a 360 view of its ongoing, it's the ideal place for a catchup over a tee on the course and lunch afterward.

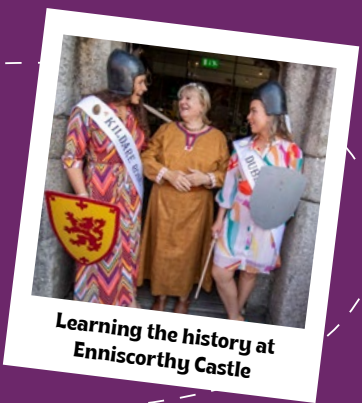
If You Have Time
